What you need to start a chapter

- 1. A faculty adviser, who must be a regular member of the ASBMB.
- 2. At least five student members.
- 3. Register the chapter at www.asbmb.org/ student-chapters (must be completed by the adviser).
- Pay annual chapter dues of \$200, which covers the first 10 members. Dues are \$20 for each additional member.

- 1. Organize regular on-campus meetings.
- 2. Conduct science outreach in local community.
- 3. Recruit new members.
